To bring a permanent end to the 22-30 daily Veteran suicide epidemic (<https://tvfaz.org/>) by empowering Veterans and their families suffering from the life threatening medical condition of TBI and PTS with resources, support and services. One of the cornerstone services of the Team Veteran Foundation Wellness Clinics is the Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) chambers for the treatment of the physical brain injuries suffered during a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI). There are NO double-blind studies that prove the efficacy of psychotropic drugs for the treatment of TBI (all 50 drugs are "off-label" for TBI) and only 5 are "on-label" to treat PTS.

Team Veteran Foundation has been offered an opportunity to acquire a TEKNA 8400 D/L multiplace HBOT chamber for \$250,000 plus the cost of shipping the unit to the Phoenix area and site setup. The founder of Team Veteran Foundation is a survivor of a near fatal Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and underwent emergency brain surgery on 11/5/2002. On 09/21/2015 he started the recommended 40 1-hour "dives" in a multiplace Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy chamber and finished the 40th dive on 11/13/2015. The TBI negatively impacted his cognition and the HBOT dives returned his cognition to normal or better.

Gordon L. Ewell, retired MSG US Army, author of *Dung in My Foxhole*, talks about HBOT & Team Veteran in his 5th book. He has committed to donate proceeds from this book to help TVF's mission to treat Veterans with HBOT.

The VA has started a program to allow Veterans to see health care professionals in the private sector, if they are not available to be seen at a VA facility in a timely manner, or if the VA does not have the specialist that they need to see at the VA facility.

Arizona Legislature has approved Hyperbaric Oxygen Treatment (HBOT) Program for Veterans. Veterans with traumatic brain injuries (TBI) and selected PTSD conditions would be eligible to participate in hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT) under a bill approved unanimously in the state House (Feb. 21), and unanimously by the Senate (Mar 26). It was signed by the Governor on March 29.

The following conditions are treated with hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT). The first group are the conditions approved by the FDA. The second group are conditions that are treated worldwide with hyperbaric oxygen therapy (HBOT). If you have questions please use our [contact us](#) page.

Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy (HBOT) for FDA Approved Conditions:
